About the Park Site

Klondike Gold Rush National Historical Park- Seattle is one of four national park sites included within Seattle Area National Park Sites. After surviving a devastating fire and an economic depression, Seattle flourished with the Klondike Gold Rush. As a key port city, merchants supplied would-be Klondike Kings and Queens on their way to Alaska. This cemented Seattle as an anchor of the Pacific Northwest. Today the park is your gateway to learn about the gold rush, explore Seattle area parks, and be involved with the local community.

About the Position

The Community Volunteer Ambassador (CVA) will act as a full-fledged member of the park's outreach team and interact directly with partners. The CVA intern will provide assistance with volunteer management, training and recruitment. The intern will work directly as a mentor in the In My Backyard program- the park's conservation leadership development and youth outreach program. The intern will support this and the park units around the Seattle area in expanding service-learning activities, and community engagement programs. The intern will coordinate projects and activities with the guidance of park management, and host events that provide opportunities to increase community volunteerism, such as coordinating with the park's City to Summit Program – a program aimed at connecting local Seattle communities with volunteer and recreation opportunities at Olympic and Mount Rainier National Parks and Ebey's Landing National Historical Preserve.
